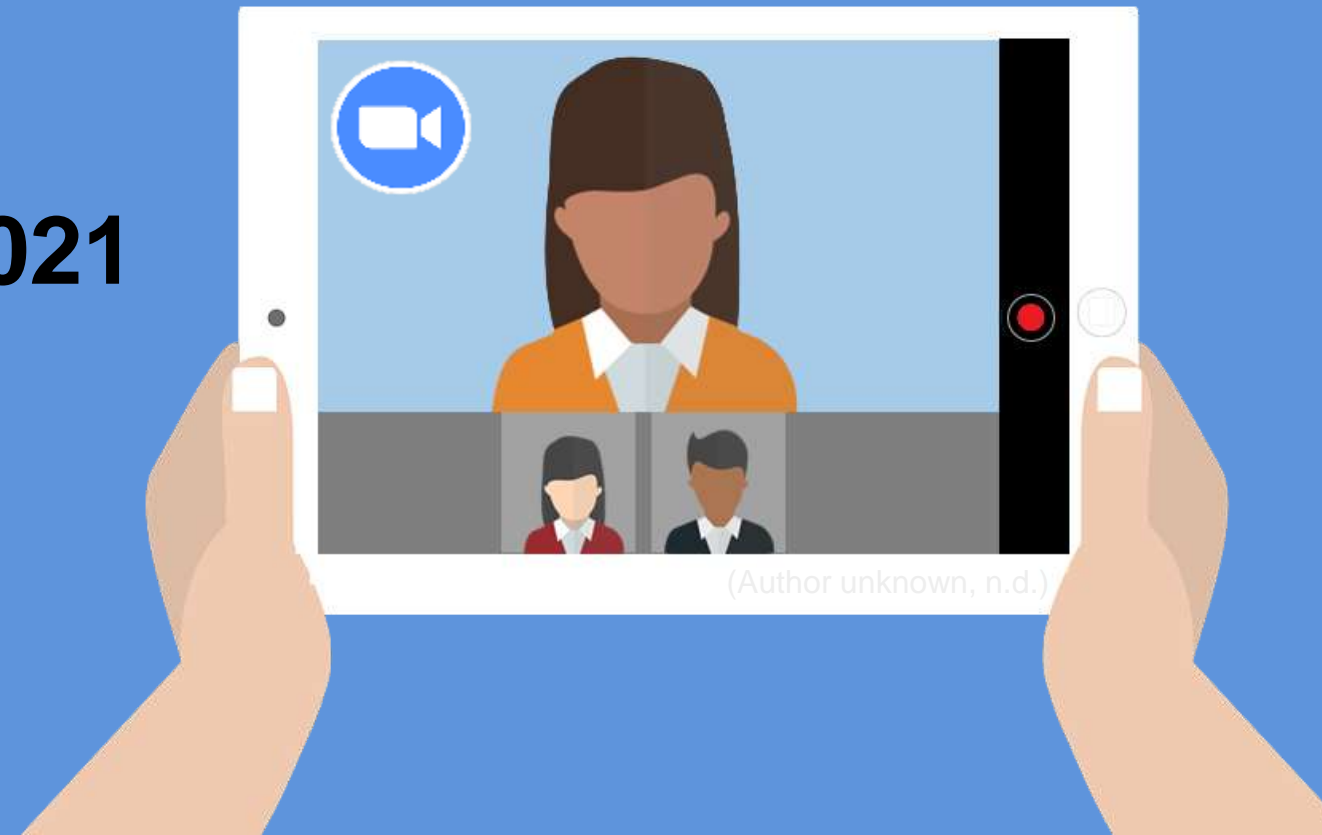

Speaker View and Gallery View

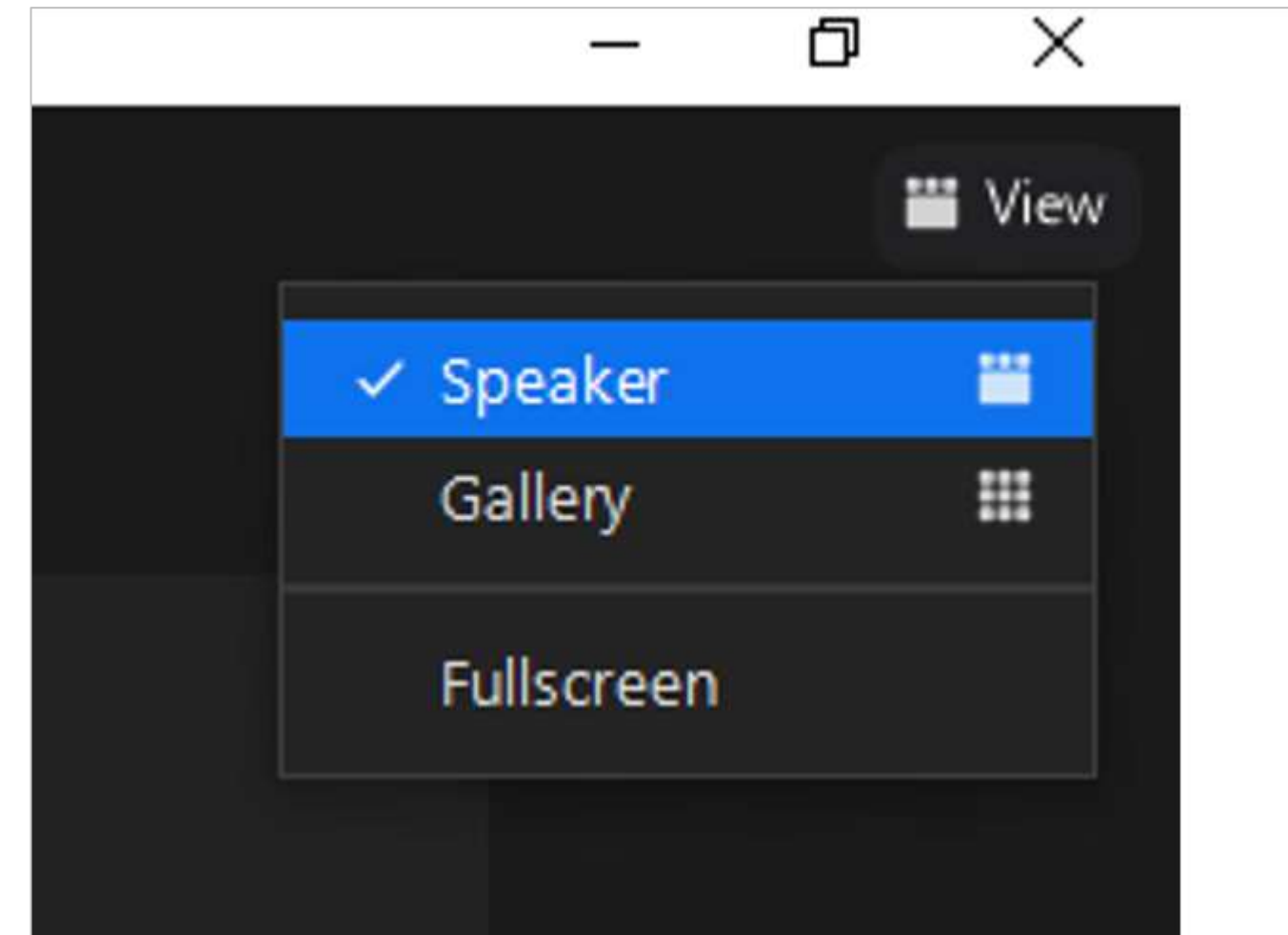

The speaker's video picture is big in Speaker View.



Speaker View can be helpful when there is only one speaker presenting at a time, which often happens at iCON chronic disease management webinars and forums.
